1 OFFICIALS

- 1.1 Positions to be filled are:
- Convenor
 - Umpires Convenor
 - Rep Convenor
 - Rep Coaches (2)
 - Rep Managers (2)
 - Rep Selectors (6) (3 for Opens and 3 for Under 16's)
- 1.2 Officials will be selected according to the ISA Officials Election Procedure.
- 1.3 Meetings
- 1.3.1 The Netball Committee will consist of the school's Netball Co-ordinator of each school.
- 1.3.2 Meetings will be set by the Director of ISA Sport. There are currently two standing meetings held annually, these being:
- Annual Pre-Season Fixtures Meeting.
 - An end-of-season meeting to assess the competition in retrospect. This will be held after Representative fixtures have been completed.
- 1.3.3 The Director of ISA Sport may call for a meeting to be convened at any time should this be warranted.

2 THE COMPETITION STRUCTURE

2.1 **Registration**

Each school is to complete their own team registration forms and to present to the Convenor those teams which qualify for semis/finals.

2.2 **Draw**

2.2.1 The draw will be organised by the Netball committee in consultation with Director, with each school and team playing on a home and away basis.

2.2.2 Wherever possible, 6 teams per grade.

2.3 **Home Team Responsibilities**

- 2.3.1 Provide a HOME court convenor that approaches the travelling school on arrival to confirm organisation of the games.
- 2.3.2 To provide a suitable venue for fixtures. Courts should be suitably marked with a safety zone of at least 1.5 metres around the outside.
- 2.3.3 To provide comprehensive first aid kits, ice at each venue, and post pads.
- 2.3.4 To advise Australian Associated Press (AAP) of the day's results on 9322 8000 before 5.00pm on Saturday or fax 9322 8742. Please also send full results to the Daily Telegraph by Monday morning, Fax 9288 2608, email: murrayka@dailystelegaph.com.au
- 2.3.5 To provide official score sheets for each scheduled game. These must be collected at the completion of the games, checked that they are filled in correctly and kept for future reference if required.
- 2.3.6 To keep time with a bell or hooter. Don't allow any time wasting. Each court may be timed separately provided an adequate system is put in place.
- 2.3.7 To fax/email the results sheet provided to the ISA Netball Convenor by the following Monday.
- 2.3.8 The home team has the choice in providing morning or afternoon tea to the visiting team. It is recommended that this social event take place as this is one of the benefits of a school based competition.
- 2.3.9 Home Team checklist:
- Score sheets
 - First Aid kit and ice
 - Results sheet
 - Draw
 - Spare whistles
 - Timer
 - Bell or hooter
 - ISA Netball Guidelines
 - ISA Code of Conduct for Players, Coaches and Spectators
 - Rules

NOTE: All Coaches must read and sign the ISA Code of Conduct for Coaches before the start of each season. All Coaches must carry the laminated copy of the Code with their coaching kit to each ISA fixture.

2.4 Games

- 2.4.1 Games to be played according to All Australia Netball rules with 2 minutes injury time. If the player is unable to be moved, the game will be moved to another court or resumed when possible. No injury time will be added to the end of the quarter except in semi-finals and finals. The umpire/home court supervisor is to direct the injured player to quickly decide if she can play on or is to be replaced.
- 2.4.2 Length of games:

4 x 15 minutes

2 minute break between first and second and third and fourth quarters.

5 minute break at half time, except if a shorter time is agreed on by both convenors prior to the day beginning.

- 2.4.3 Game times: Four time slots 9.00 am
 10.15 am
 11.30 am
 12.45pm

or a convenient time arranged between both opposing teams/schools.

- 2.4.4 In the event of a double header, the team playing 2 games chooses which team they play first.

2.5 **Players**

- 2.5.1 Players may play up in age and grade but not down.

- 2.5.2 Players to play only one game per day/round. However provided the Co-ordinators or persons in charge of either team are in agreement then a player may play two games on the one day to ensure that the game can be played. The player concerned may not play down.

- 2.5.3 If a player plays more than 2 games in a higher grade or age group, she must complete the competition as part of that team. On the third game, she must continue competition in higher grade. Penalty - loss of game and loss of 2 points.

- 2.5.4 Only registered players allowed to play and students must be enrolled and attending a member school. To play in the semi-finals and/or finals, a player must have played in a minimum of 3 games during the season for the team that qualified in the semi finals and/or finals. Players to conduct themselves according to the ISA Guidelines for Players. All students playing in an ISA competition, must be enrolled and attending a Member or Associate ISA School, and be in Years 7 – 12.

2.6 **Point system**

(An illegal forfeit will occur when a team does not notify the opposing school of a forfeit.)

2.6.2 **Wet Weather**

In the event of a wash out there is to be no replay of washed out fixtures and neither team receives any points. In collating points for semi's, finals or end of season premiers, allocated points are added together and then divided by the number of games actually played.

2.6.3 First and second seeded only will be in the Finals. This will be determined by the season's point score. If two teams are equal, the ISA Competition placing formula is applied:

ISA COMPETITION PLACINGS FORMULA

1.1 Points competition placing, divided by number of games actually played. *(includes forfeit)*

1.2 If equal: $\frac{\text{points for}}{\text{Points against}} \times \frac{100}{\text{number of games Played.}}$ *(Don't include forfeits)*

1.3 If still equal, 2 teams concerned, difference points for and against.

2.6.4 Semi Finals: The decision to include semi-finals will depend on the draw and this decision will be made by the ISA Netball committee. The structure of the semi-finals will be: 1 v 4 and 2 v 3. In the event of semi-finals and finals there must be a winner. Hence:

- a) the teams will change ends and play five minutes each way with a two minute break in between.
- b) If the game remains a draw, then the captains will toss for centre/goal end and the game continues until one team obtains a two point advantage.

2.7 Wet weather

2.7.1 Whenever possible, the home team is to notify the opposing school before the visiting school's bus departs on the Saturday morning. If possible, notify on the Friday.

2.7.2 It is the decision of the home court supervisor to determine when a game should stop due to wet weather.

2.7.3 If a game reaches half time, the half time score counts. If the game does not reach half time, it is classified as a washout.

2.8 Uniform

2.8.1 No bike pants unless medical certificate supplied. Players must leave the court and only take the court after the bike pants are removed and there is a break in play.

2.8.2 No caps except designated school uniform caps. Brims must be soft.

2.8.3 No jewellery.

2.8.4 Nails should be short, round and smooth.

2.9 Blood Bin

If a player is bleeding, they must leave the court until no blood is showing. Clothing must also be free of blood. If a replacement player goes on for a blood bin injury, they must stay on till the quarter break. If not replaced, the blood injury player, when free of blood, may return to the game at a break.

2.10 Umpires

2.10.1 Each school must provide one umpire for each game.

2.10.2 A level of competency and confidence is expected.

2.10.3 All players should be encouraged to sit for the NSW Umpires Theory exam and/or complete the ISA Umpires Badging System.

2.10.4 All umpires should be in PE uniform, whites or playing uniform.

2.11 Code of Conduct

Coaches, players and spectators to abide by ISA's Guidelines.

3 REPRESENTATIVE INFORMATION

3.1 Team selections

3.1.1 A team will be selected in both the Open and Under 16 divisions.

3.1.2 Players must be nominated by completing a Nomination Form prior to selection. The Nomination Forms must be completed correctly and signed by the Head of School.

3.1.3 Players must be given all representative details prior to selections.

3.1.4 ISA Representative teams will participate in the C.IS. Netball Carnival each year.

3.1.5 Members of the ISA Netball teams will be eligible for selection in the Combined Independent Schools (CIS) Netball teams.

3.1.6 At the CIS Netball Carnival, all ISA players must have a minimum of one quarter of the total game time.
